

Fran Rish

Fran is a native of Yakima, Washington, where he played high school football under Johnny Zeaphel. He then entered Washington State College and played three years of varsity football as an end for the legendary "Babe" Hollingberry, graduating in 1941. In 1942 he became coach of the "Frosh" team at WSC. Shortly thereafter he entered the Army and played football, as a quarterback, for the 1944 Amarillo, Texas, service team which lost only two games. The following year, 1945, he took over as coach and lost only one game during the season.

In 1946 "Rish" came to Richland and took over the helm of both the football and baseball programs for the Bombers. After a 4-3 mark in 1946 and a 4-5 record in 1947, Rish put together a string of 12 straight winning football seasons. In 1950 he was named as a coach of the all-state team, the first coach in the league to attain that honor. During one period, Rish's Bombers lost only 5 of 47 games. From 1946 until 1966, Rish's last year as football coach, his teams won 106 games, lost 63 and tied 10. During this period the Bombers won 8 championships and were rated in the state's final polls 10 times.

In 1967 Rish became the director of Athletics and Physical Education for the entire Richland School District, a position he has held through this school year. He continued as coach of the baseball team until 1976.

In total, Rish coached football for 21 years and baseball for 30 years—a grand total of 51 seasons.
