Pasco ends promising season on losing note

The Pasco Bulldogs started a promising season winning two of their first three games and rolling out the most prolific passing attack in the Mid-Columbia Conference.

But things didn't end well for Pasco on Friday, as the Bulldogs lost their seventh game in a row, falling 51-21 to Mead in a District 5/8 crossover win in Spokane.

Eric Orange hauled in a 14-yard touchdown pass from Kolby Killoy to give the Bulldogs a 7-0 first quarter lead. But the Panthers scored the next 44 points to take a 44-7 halftime lead.

A.J. Layton led Mead's rushing attack with 125 yards and three touchdowns on ten carries, and Anthony Gold chipped in 97 yards and two touchdowns on just six carries.

Killoy, who led the Mid-Columbia Conference in passing, completed 20 of 35 passes for 213 yards and three touchdowns, but he also threw three interceptions.
